What is Pre-Need Cemetery Planning?

Pre-Need Cemetery Planning allows you to make all the decisions and arrangements for your final resting place, in advance of your passing.

Many people also chose to make pre-need arrangements for their spouse or significant other at the same time as their own so that they may ensure that they are placed to rest together.

Pre-Need Planning allows you to:

1. Select exactly what you and your loved one want
2. Avoid putting your loved ones in the difficult position of having to make emotional decisions and purchases at the time of your passing
3. Save money (lock in today's prices for use in the future)
4. Have peace of mind for you and your family

The benefits of Pre-Need Planning are making it more common

In Washington, PA, 7 out of 10 families have already made some type of pre-need arrangement.

At Washington Cemetery, we offer 3 options for Pre-Need Planning

- 1) Traditional Grave Space
- 1) Mausoleum Crypts
- 2) Cremation (grave or niches)

1.) Traditional Grave Space



To purchase grave space, you will have to select:

- a. Grave sites
- b. Openings & closings at time of death
- c. Memorial (flat grass or upright monument)

* You can either do this all at once or a little at a time

(Most people purchase 2 graves & 2 openings initially)



2.) Mausoleum Crypt

A mausoleum crypt includes:

- Crypt
- Casket enclosure
- Bronze crypt front (this is the memorial on the front of the crypt)
- Opening and closing of the crypt
- Use of the Chapel Mausoleum for the cemetery service



(Most people purchase 2 of these crypts – one for each spouse or significant other)

3.) Cremation

Cremated remains can either be buried in the ground (similar to a traditional grave) or above ground in a niche.

Once you decide what option you would like, we will help you:

- Select a specific location
 - If you have family already buried at our cemetery, we may be able to offer you a space in the same section
- Decide how to pay for your pre-need selection

The **Washington Cemetery** was incorporated in March 1853 as a not-for-profit, non-sectarian, traditional Cemetery. The Cemetery encompasses 245 acres in North Franklin Township and has performed over 48,000+ burials. The Cemetery is comprised of 2 maintenance buildings, one administration building, four community mausoleums, and one crematorium. Over 7 miles of roadway wind through the grounds with 4 miles of water lines for lot owner convenience. The Washington Cemetery is the largest not-for-profit, non-sectarian, traditional Cemetery in Washington County.
